I have tried to eliminate the fear of the memory features used by many variations of Precision by presenting a series of bids that are geared toward simplicity and allow the reader to integrate the Precision system into their more familiar natural bidding system using the 2/1 Game Force bidding structure which includes Combined Bergen Raises, inverted minor suit raises with criss-cross, cue bidding, modified scroll bids, and many more familiar methods.

In addition, Ken has published two books on bidding, *The Casey 2/1 Bridge Bidding System* (4th ed. 2021) and *The Casey Simplified Precision Club Bridge Bidding System* (2nd ed. 2021). Ken served as a Russian interpreter during the Vietnam War and then spent over 30 years practicing as a tax attorney. Ken also has an MBA in accounting and a CPA. To remedy this situation, one may employ the strong club system in contract or duplicate bridge know simply as Precision.

The Casey 2/1 Bridge Bidding System Ken Casey 2020-12-20 This book incorporates the 2/1 Game Force bidding system whenever the opener bids a major suit. Five new conventions have been added to the 2/1 system. This book is also designed to improve your bidding of minor suit openings in 4 steps. The 1st step involves the use of the Casey-Jacoby Transfer and the Casey overcall (a 1NT bid shows 4 hearts). The 2nd step involves adoption of the strong 2 bid, a bid of 20-21p. This allows the opener to use the Casey Reverse to show a hand of 16-17p by bidding at the 2-level and to show a hand of 18-19p by bidding at the 3-level. The Casey Minor Suit Rebid convention allows O to show a 4+ card suit at the 2 or 3-level. The 3rd step involves optimizing your slam bidding with the Casey Trump Queen convention and the Casey-Minorwood Kickback convention. The 4th step involves the use of the Weak-1NT (a 1NT bid shows 4 hearts) and Weak-2NT bids, both designed to hamper the opponents.

To be effective, bidding must be comprehensive and therefore complicated; without hierarchical organization, bidding is hard to remember. What can't be remembered can't be used effectively. A system is easier to remember than a disconnected group of rules. This system is just that—a system. Bidding sequences and responses outlined herein are as natural and as simple as possible. An attempt is made to discern general principles that are useful in a variety of situations. Gump divides opening bids into several category types and each type of opening bid is a system unto itself. Categories include 1C which is forcing and shows 16-22 hcp, one of a major shows 11-15 hcp and a 5+ card suit, 1D shows the bids remaining hands that have 11-15 hcp. 1NT shows a 19-21 hcp balanced hcp hand with a possible 5 card major suit, 2C shows a strong forcing opening with 23+ hcp, 2NT shows a balanced 22-24 hcp, and 3NT shows a huge hand with a balanced 31-33 hcp. This system features negative free bids and negative free bid doubles, making these bids into general principles that are a part of many defensive and competitive situations. Slam bidding features Q bids that tell about a control in a suit and ask for control of

another specific suit as a prelude to a variety of Roman Keycard—type asks. Kickback and Baby Roman Keycard Blackwood are ways of making asks at levels lower than 4NT. Learning and playing this system will move a player and his partner to a higher level and introduce new ideas to all but the well—rounded expert student of the game of bridge. Even then, the expert will have food for thought.
