He speaks fluent Bulgarian and English and says his main interests are all sports, cars, computers and watches. He is nicknamed G-Force, Dimi, PT (Prime Time). His first major junior coup was when, at aged 14 he claimed the U14 European title. In 2006 he won the Orange Bowl U16 boys singles and was later named the Eddie Herr International 2007 Rising Star. In 2007, Grigor was the finalist at the Orange Bowl U18 boys singles, losing to Ri ardas Berankis of Lithuania. He was six times world champion in the years 1976, 1977, 1979, 1981, and 1983-1984. On the other hand he was Europe's champion in 1999 before Ton Sijbrands!
