Many important concepts must be mastered in order to develop an explosive, consistent, intelligent game. This book explains basic knowledge of wrist biomechanics, the concept of multiple sweet spots, direction and intensity of effort, proprioception, and most important is the concept of a segmented impact. The fifth concept is actually a totally segmented approach to the game. The idea is to have one micro-goal after another.
